

# More health tests required for Canadian cattle imports

Department of Agriculture (USDA) has been notified that Canada has changed its anaplasmosis and bluetongue regulations for non-slaughter cattle exported from the United States into Canada. The new requirements on the two diseases became effective Oct. 27.

Officials of USDA's Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service emphasized that the new Canadian regulations do not affect cattle shipped to

WASHINGTON - The U.S. Canada for immediate from other animals that slaughter.

The new import rules require all cattle in the herd of origin to be inspected within 30 days before importation and found free of these two communicable livestock diseases. Examining veterinarians will also have to certify that to the best of their knowledge neither anaplasmosis nor bluetounge has existed in the herd for two years before export to Canada.

Exported animals must be shown free of anaplasmosis by a negative complementfixation test within 30 days before export.

must be shown by two such from offices of APHIS' tests - the first one being Veterinary Service, and made not less than 30 days from the Import-Export nor more than 90 days before export, and the second within 30 days. Animals being tested must be isolated

have not been tested.

The requirements are modified to some extent if the herds of origin have been tested and found free of these diseases within the preceding year, including prescribed tests on the animals being shipped.


Canadian import regulations previously had required veterinarians to cerftify herd-of-origin for freedom only anaplasmosis, and had required only one test for bluetounge.




Reeves looked as if a blitzing linebacker had just nailed him in the backfield. "Why not?" he asked. "You fumble too much," his wife replied.
