

# Recognition awards presented to five Md. extension agents

Four county Extension agents in Maryland and one Extension supervisor at the University of Maryland in College Park have been honored during the past five weeks by national associations for professional workers employed by the Cooperative Extension Service.

All five of the honorees have West Virginia or western Maryland backgrounds, although two

of them are currently working on one county in the Upper Bay region of northeast Maryland.

The line-up of honorees includes:

Harford county - Lynn T. Warman of Forest Hill, a county Extension agricultural science agent at Bel Air since 1957 and chairman of the Harford county Extension staff since 1964. He received the Distinguished Service

Award for Maryland at the 60th annual meeting of the National Association of County Agricultural Agents, held last month (Sept. 28-Oct. 20) in Milwaukee, Wis.

Also, J. William Clark of Bel Air, a 4-H and youth agent in Harford county since 1968. He received one of two Distinguished Service Awards for Maryland at the annual meeting of the National Association of Extension 4-H agents, being

held this week (Nov. 3-7) at Louisville, Ky.

Allegany county - Charles J. D. McVeigh, Jr., of Cumberland, a county Extension agricultural science agent in western Maryland since 1969. He received the Achievement Award for Maryland at the 60th annual meeting of the National Association of County Agricultural Agents, held last month (Sept. 28-Oct. 2) in Milwaukee, Wis.

Garrett county - Mrs. Hugh (Freda S.) Denison of Oakland, a member of the county Extension staff since 1961 and Extension home economics agent in Garrett county since 1965. She received the Distinguished Service Award for Maryland at the annual meeting of the National Association of Extension Home Economists, held last week (Oct. 27-31) in Knoxville, Tenn.

Prince Georges county - David D. Eigenbrode, a resident of the Montpelier area south of Laurel. For-

merly a 4-H agent in both Baltimore and Frederick counties, Eigenbrode has been employed at the University of Maryland in College Park since 1968 as a supervisor for 4-H and youth activities of the statewide Cooperative Extension Service.

He received one of two Distinguished Service Awards for Maryland at the annual meeting of the National Association of Extension 4-H Agents, held last week (Nov. 3-7) at Louisville, Ky.

## What's New

A new type of all-steel metal building for farm use has been introduced by the Mitchell Engineering Company of Columbus, Mississippi, a pioneer in the metal-building field. The new building is called MECO-MASTER, and comes in a series of sizes that can be used for farm shops, farm grain storage, equipment storage, or warehousing for feed, seed, fertilizer, hay, cotton and other agricultural commodities.

MECO-MASTER buildings are available in two basic configurations: 50 feet wide by 17 feet eave height and 40 feet wide by 15 feet eave height. The 50 foot wide building is available in any length in increments of 20 feet with a 40 foot minimum length. The 40 foot building is available in any length in 25 foot increments with a 50 foot minimum length.

Maximum size sliding doors are available to accommodate the vast majority of opening requirements. For example, the 50 foot by 17 foot eave height MECO-MASTER building is available with a 24 foot by 16 foot double sliding door to meet the requirements of cotton pickers (including cab and air conditioning unit), combines with the widest head (including cab and air conditioning unit, and six row tillage equipment.

Designed for easy, fast erection, the basic MECO-MASTER building includes all primary and secondary structural framing, 26 gauge commercial grade galvanized roof and wall panels, galvanized flashing and trim, base angle, ridge cap, eave and base closures, structural bolts and galvanized panel fasteners.

Heavy-duty roof and wall panels are 26 gauge steel Mitchell Architectural Panels with a 1½ inch high major ribs for maximum leak prevention and attractive exterior appearance. The roof slope is two inches in 12 inches for additional leak protection.

Options include factory baked on paint for roof and walls. Roof available with white panels. Walls available in choice of six colors. Other options include blanket fiberglass insulation, round ridge ventilators, green or white translucent wall lights, and steel pedestrian doors. As an additional farm option, a bulk grain storage kit for flat grain storage may be obtained.

MECO-MASTER buildings are available through dealers located across the country. The company's main plant and headquarters office is located at Columbus, Mississippi, with other manufacturing operations in Rocky Mount, North Carolina and Mt. Pleasant, Iowa.

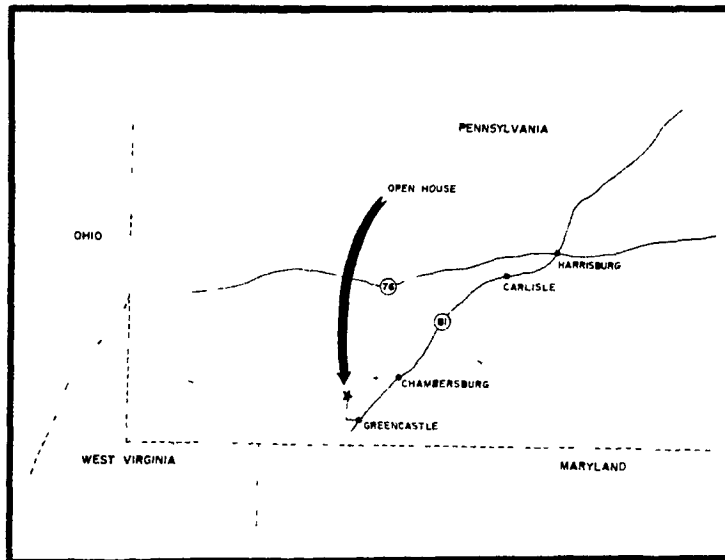
