Compared to last week: Feeder Steers under 600 lb. 1.00-3.00 higher, steers over 600 lb. 50 cents to 1.00 higher, Feeder Heifers 1.00-2.00 higher, with most upturn noted on weights under 500 lb. Slaughter cows closed the week mostly 1.00-2.00 higher, with most advance on canner and cutter. Slaughter bulls finished steady to firm, slaughter heifers 50 cents to 1.00 higher, instances 2.00 higher on 400-500 lb. Salable receipts this week totaled near 21,500 head, compared to 26,752 last week, and 19,207 one year ago. Cows comprised near 18 percent, feeders near 78 percent of total.

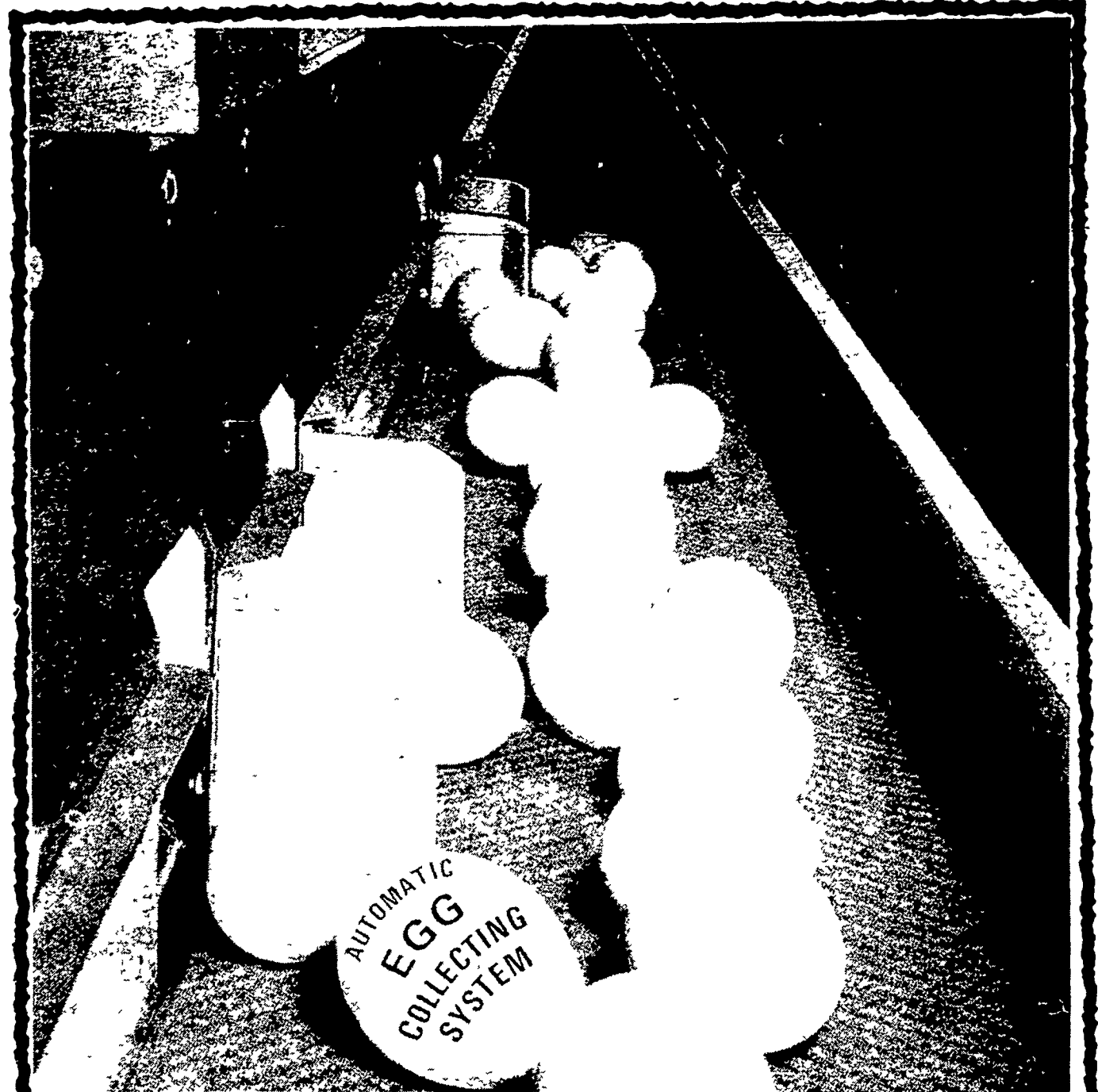
