Keystone Expo begins today

HARRISBURG - The 1975 Keystone International Livestock Exposition to be held at the Farm Show complex Nov. 8-14 will include a new horse event and reminders of the nation's impending 200th birthday. During this 19th annual exposition of the best livestock from 23 states and Canada, more judging contests and events will be held on Saturday and Sunday than in previous years to encourage a larger attendance, according to exposition officials.

On the opening day, Saturday, a new Paint Horse Show will be held in the large arena beginning at 1:00 p.m. In all, 73 entries are expected to appear in this show.

Visitors to the exposition will be able to take a wagon ride each day from 9:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. The driver, Edgar Messerschmidt of Myerstown, will have his wagon and horse team hitched and waiting in the parking lot.

This year the livestock exposition, featuring nearly 1,000 head of beef cattle, swine, sheep and horses, will have exhibitors competing for more than \$80,000 in premiums. For the first time premiums are being offered in the halter classes of the four horse shows.

Numerous breeds of sheep, swine, horses, and beef cattle will be judged beginning on Saturday and continuing throughout the week. Several exotic cattle breeds will be judged again this year including the

Limousin, Chianina and Simmental beef cattle.

Other special events scheduled include the Northeast Regional 4-H and Intercollegiate Horse Judging Contest on Nov. 8; Regional 4-H Horse Bowl at the Penn Ram Motor Inn, Nov. 8 and the Pa. Lamb and Wool Queen Contest to be staged in the Sheep Arena on Nov. 8.

During most of the week, visitors to the Farm Show complex will be able to view

four separate rings of animal activity. The beef cattle will be in the poultry room, horses in the large arena, and sheep in a corral in the main.

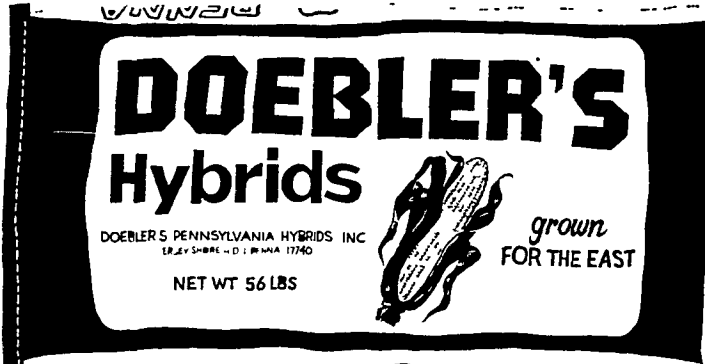
