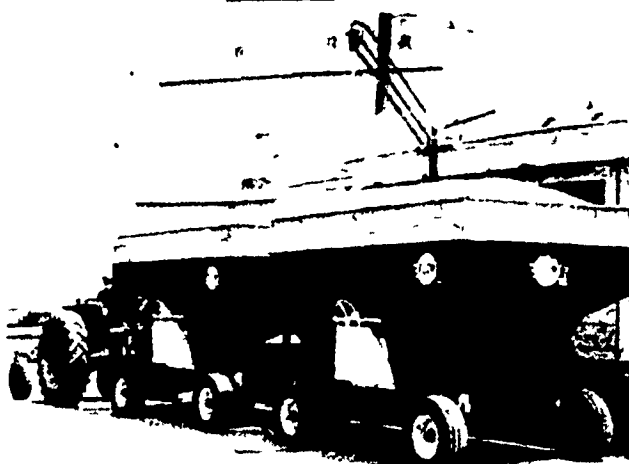
Folklore
