Canned Goods Make Excellent Presents

Pint jars of pickles, relishes and vegetables make an attractive gift when arranged in small baskets or decorated boxes. Combine goods with homemade cookies and candies or an added treat.

Dill Pickles

3 3/4 cups vinegar and 1 quart water

6 cups sugar
3 tablespoons salt
4 1/2 teaspoons turmeric
3/4 teaspoon mustard seed
1/2 teaspoon dill to each quart jar

Make syrup boiling. Slice pickles thin and pack in jars. Pour syrup over and process in boiling water about 5 minutes. This makes about 7 quarts.

Waffles

2 cups flour
1 teaspoon salt
4 teaspoons baking powder
2 tablespoons sugar
6 tablespoons melted butter
2 eggs, separated
1 1/2 cups milk

Sift dry ingredients into a mixing bowl. Beat egg yolks and add milk. Combine with flour mixture and add

melted butter. Fold in stiffly beaten egg whites. Bake in hot waffle iron. Makes 6 waffles.

Peanut Butter Pie

Filling

3/4 cup confectioner's sugar
1/2 cup peanut butter
two-thirds cup granulated sugar

3 tablespoons corn starch
1 tablespoon flour
pinch of salt
3 egg yolks
3 cups milk
2 tablespoons butter

1 teaspoon vanilla
Beat three egg whites until stiff and add 1/4 teaspoon cream of tartar and 1/4 cup granulated sugar.

Cream confectioner's sugar and peanut butter until crumbly and set aside. Stir next 8 ingredients together in sauce pan. Cook over medium heat stirring constantly. Bring to just below boiling point and cook a few minutes more. Sprinkle two-thirds cups of peanut butter mixture into bottom of pie shell. Pour custard over this. Spread beaten egg whites on top and make meringue. Bake until browned.

Emergency loans okayed;

The Department of Agriculture has authorized the receiving of emergency loan applications pursuant to Section 321 of the Consolidated Farm and Rural Development Act, as amended by Public Law 94-68, in certain counties in Pennsylvania. Loan applications may be received through November 27, 1975, for physical losses and June 28, 1976, for production losses from eligible farmers in the following counties:

Adams, Berks, Bradford, Centre, Clinton, Columbia, Cumberland, Dauphin, Franklin, Fulton, Juniata, Lackawanna, Lancaster, Lebanon, Luzerne, Lycoming, Mifflin, Montour, Northumberland, Perry, Potter, Schuylkill, Snyder, Sullivan, Susquehanna, Tioga, Union, Wayne, Wyoming, York.

Individuals desiring information about emergency loans or other types of assistance available through this agency should get in touch with the local County Supervisor of the Farmers Home Administration serving their county.
