Gardner, a 21 year old professional puppeteer, will perform the skits, "Turkey Delight" and "The Giving Tree." The show is part of a tour Gardner is making to area community clubs, libraries, and theatres.

Some of Gardners performances include presentations at the Harrisburg and Lebanon Valley Arts Festivals, the 1974 Puppet Festival at Tulane University in New local television.

This summer, he was funded by the Pennsylvania Department of Education to teach English, via original puppet shows, to Vietnamese refugees at Indiantown Gap. Different puppeteering

techniques will characterize the two short skits which Gardner, a H.A.C C. and also fashioned puppets for "Turkey Delight" will employ marrionettes, and in "The Giving Tree" hand puppets will be used. Barbara Beatty, of Harrisburg, will be Gardners assistant.

A self-taught professional, Gardner has designed and constructed over 50 marrionettes and hand puppets, which he uses in both original and adapted shows. Gardner is currently assembling his six original works written publication.

Mr. Gardner is also the puppeteer - ın - residence with the Harrisburg School Orleans, and appearances on District, the Children's Theatre Group at H.A.C.C., and the Central Pennsylvania Summer Theatre.




