

Late game season due

Small game and deer hunters will take to the fields and forests for the final times in 1975 when the late small game and whitetail seasons open on Friday, December 26.

Small game species which may be hunted from December 29 through Saturday, January 17, include pheasants of both sexes in northern Pennsylvania, and cottontail rabbits, squirrels and grouse statewide. Daily and possession limits for these species are: pheasants, two and four; cottontail, four and eight; squirrels, six and twelve; and grouse, two and four.

Deer of any age or sex will be available from December 26 to January 17 to archers throughout the state who

have not already taken a whitetail by that time.

This year there will again be a split season for hunting show-shoe rabbits (varying hares), covering two Saturdays. The first season will be on December 26 and 27, while the second season will be on January 1, 2 and 3. The daily limit on snowshoes is two, with a season limit of four.

And this year for the first time there will be a split season for hunting deer with muzzleloaders. Those using primitive-type firearms will be able to hunt whitetails on December 26 through 27, and again on January 1, 2 and 3.

The only firearms that may be used during the muzzleloader season are single barrel flintlock ignition long guns of .44

caliber or larger propelling a single ball. Telescope sights are prohibited.

The muzzleloader season, which requires a separate muzzleloader license available from county treasurers and at Game Commission field division offices, will be confined to 37 designated state game lands.

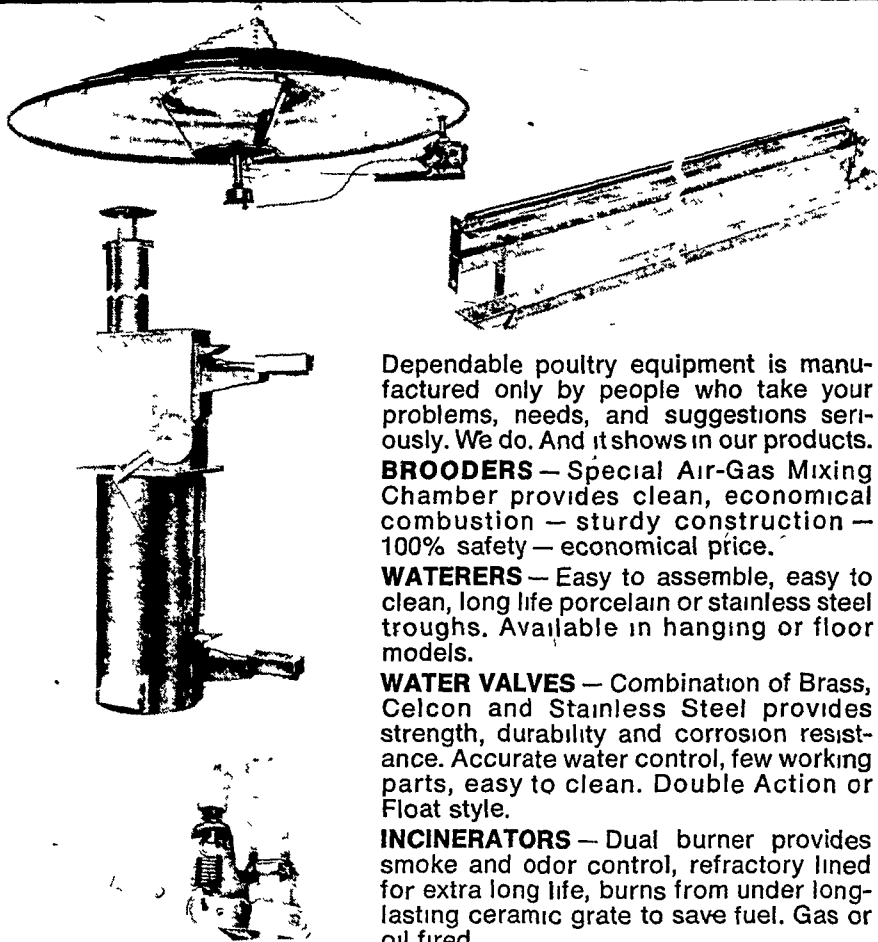
