



Lebanon DHIA MONTHLY REPORT

The high herd in the Lebanon County DHIA program for November were the 78 Holsteins belonging to Norman Kline. They produced an average of 51.2 pounds of milk and 2.07 pounds of butterfat per day per cow during the 34-day testing period.

The individual milk and butterfat production champs for the month belonged to Hubert S. Miller and Willow Maple Farms, respectively. Miller's five-year-old "Mildred" chalked up a record totalling 26,357 pounds of milk, and 854 pounds of butterfat.

The 955 pounds of butterfat produced by Willow Maple's "Orpha" was tops in the butterfat race.
