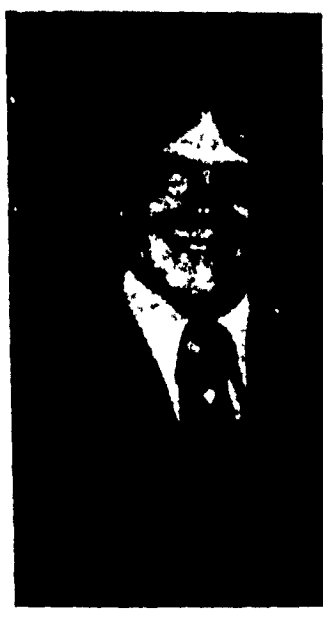


# FFA'ers receive Keystone Degrees

**Robert Bair**


