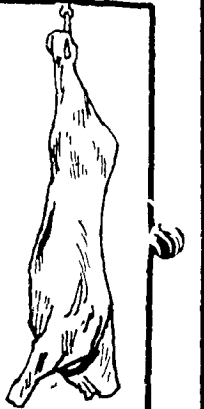

## Area residents attend seminar

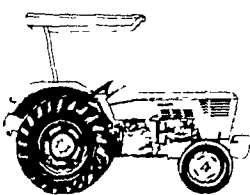
