OLD FARMER'S WEATHER FORECASTS

New England: Cold snap, mostly sunny and dry to start, then some flurries in mountains; partly cloudy and seasonably cold latter part, some general snow flurries by weekend

Greater New York-New Jersey: Increasing clouds and colder with light snow midweek, latter part some light snow, partly clear and continuing cold

Middle Atlantic Coastal: Early week cold with moderately heavy snow and freezing rain, becoming lighter midweek, clearing and seasonable latter part

Piedmont & Southeast Coastal: Rainy at first, some snow in mountains, then sunny but cold; week ends with light rain, sub-normal temperatures

Florida: Light rain to start, then clear and cold with some frost, warming weekend with moderate rain

Upstate N.Y.-Toronto & Montreal: Week begins with cold snap, intermittent rain or snow, light precipitation latter part, snow in mountains and turning much colder in west

Greater Ohio Valley: Early part of week cold and snow, latter part mostly clear, dry and seasonable, except for scattered light snow in east

Deep South: Rain ends, then cloudy and cold, warm rain latter part clearing and colder by week's end

Chicago & Southern Great Lakes: Week begins cloudy, seasonable, some light snow, then some sun with light snow in east and central, end of week clearing and much colder.

Northern Great Lakes: Week's weather alternates between light snow and clearing, very cold throughout.

Central Great Plains: Flurries in central, light rain in south to start, then slight warming by midweek, latter part cloudy and mild, snowstorm in northwest

Texas-Oklahoma: Rainy all week, moderate to heavy in central and southeast, light in north and west.

Rocky Mountain: Early week partly cloudy and still cold, then intermittent light snow, fairly heavy snow, less in north, end of week.

Southwest Desert: Clearing and slightly warmer to start, then light rain by midweek, light to moderate rain rest of week

Pacific Northwest: Slight warming at beginning of week, then drizzle turning to rain continuing throughout, except snow in mountains

California: Early week clearing, partly sunny but continuing cold in north, cool in south, latter part rain, except snow in mountains

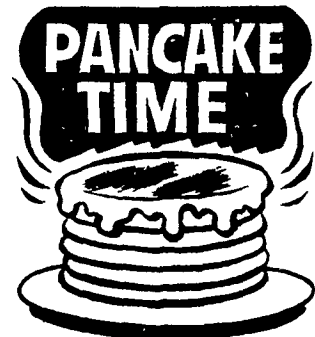
