Noah W. Wenger, a farmer from Stevens R1, on Wednesday announced he is a Republican candidate for the State House seat from the 99th District which is currently being held by the retiring Harry Gring.



Wenger, 41, operates a 107-acre livestock and poultry farm in West Cocalico Township and is a past president of the Lancaster County Farmers Association. Aside from all of his responsibilities on the farm, he also served on the Governor's Advisory Committee on Solid Waste Management and is a member of the Cocalico School Authority.

In 1970 he served as treasurer of the Pennsylvania Farmers for Hugh Scott Committee in the successful campaign to reelect the Senator to the U.S. Senate. He has presided over numerous committees in both civic and agricultural circles and is a member of the following groups. Pa Farmers Association, Pa Poultry Federation, Northeastern Poultry Producers Council, Stevens Fire Company, Schoeneck Fire Company, and the Evangelical Assembly of God Church at Ephrata. In 1975 U.S. Secretary of Agriculture Earl Butz, appointed him to be chairman of the A.S.C.S. office, with which he has been affiliated since 1972.

Married to the former Barbara Bundrick, Wenger is the father of three teen-aged daughters.
