standing milk, corn and silage producers. In the corn grain division, the results were as follows:

1. Andrew Stoltzfus, Morgantown R1, with a yield of 206.2 bushels per acre; 2. Eugene Eberly, New Holland R1, 194.4 bushels per acre; 3. Kenneth Hershey, Gordonville R1, 172.9 bushels per acre; 4. Clyde Martin, East Earl R1, 167.5 bushels per acre; 5. Ray Geissinger, New Holland R1, 164.4 bushels per acre.

In the corn silage contest, Bill Fisher took first place with a harvest of 14,950 pounds of TDN per acre. Second was Eugene Eberly, New Holland R1 with 14,208 pounds; and third Earl Weaver, New Holland R1 with 13,770 pounds.

The dairy achievement award was presented to Andrew Stoltzfus.

In the new varieties corn contest, Earl Weaver and Bill Fisher placed first and second, respectively. Weaver's yield of 157.8 bushels placed 5.1 bushels

ahead of the second-place entry. It was noted that 23 different growers competed in the contest.

The past president's award was presented by current president Harold Wissler to Norman Hershey, 1974 president.

Last year's outstanding young farmer Nathan Stoltzfus who went on to win the Pennsylvania Young Farmer Region II title last year, was recognized again to receive a belated trophy and receive notice that his name will be engraved on the Carl M. Sauder Memorial Plaque which is permanently displayed in the Garden Spot High School ag classroom. Weaver's name will also be engraved on that plaque.
