Restricted meat imports urged

WASHINGTON, D.C. The American National Cattlemen's Association recently asked President Ford to see that 1976 imports under the Meat Import law are kept well below the law's

"trigger" point. The letter from ANCA president Wray Finney followed an earlier letter pretesting the fact that the Administration let imports in 1975 exceed the "trigger" point by 27 million pounds, or 2 3 percent.

As previously reported, the State Department has been instructed to negotiate voluntary arrangements with beef supplying countries to assure that 1976 imports subject to the law will fall below the trigger level for quota imposition. The trigger point for 1976 is 1,233 million pounds (product weight).

In his most recent letter. Finney asked Ford specifically to instruct his negotiators to keep the 1976 restraint total at 1,200 million pounds or less. This would provide a "cushion" of at least 33 million pounds below the trigger level.

"It is very obvious that the

narrow margin of 17 million pounds between the trigger point and the negotiated restraint level in 1975 was anywhere near not adequate," Finney told Ford "The fact that actual imports exceed the trigger point by 27 million pounds last year makes it clear that the 'cushion' this year should be at least 33 million pounds. The need for a margin of this size is particularly great in view of the import monitoring problems which

became apparent in 1975. "It is imperative that imports in 1976 be well within the levels provided in the framework of the Meat Import Law. We strongly urge that you instruct your negotiators to see that the intent of the law is followed. This means setting the restraint level at 1,200 million pounds or less "
