Exports of farm products may top *22 billion in fiscal 1976

U.S. agricultural exports in fiscal 1976 may slightly exceed the \$21.6 billion exported in fiscal 1975. This total is slightly below the \$22.7 billion forecast in November because of a decline in price prospects. Export volume of major bulk commodities should total about 105 million metale tons - slightly over the fiscal 1974 record and a fifth above 1975's total. Unit value of exports will average lower for the important grains, soybeans, and oilseed products.

Wheat and feed grain exports are expected to reach record volumes of over 36 million and over 44 metric million tons. respectively. Sovbean exports could reach fiscal 1974's record of 14 million tons. Cotton, tobacco, and oilcake and meal exports are expected to remain near fiscal 1975 volumes, and rice and vegetable oil shipments will decline.

Shipments to the Soviet Union will show the greatest

exports to Eastern Europe. North Africa, and South Asia surplus ever. will increase also. Exports to Southeast and East Asia (excluding the People's Republic of China) will increase slightly in fiscal 1976 Lower prices will cause a drop in the value of U.S. agricultural exports to Western Europe although export volume will be greater. Exports to the Western Hemisphere will be lower in fiscal 1976. West Asia is sharply cutting back its imports of U.S. farm products, and shipments to the PRC are unlikely to exceed \$2 million, compared with the fiscal 1975 total of \$335 million.

The value of fiscal 1976 U.S. agricultural imports is expected to exceed last year's \$9.58 billion. Coffee and banana prices are up sharply; and much more vegetable oils will be imported, though at substantially lower prices.

The agricultural trade balance is thus expected to

increase in fiscal 1976, and exceed \$12 billion in fiscal 1976 and to be the largest
