

STRETCH YOUR FERTILIZER DOLLAR, LIME BEFORE PLANTING CORN

If the pH level of your corn ground is below 6.0, lime now to a pH of 7.0.

Liming now can provide you with a two-fold return: some of the lime you plow down or disc in will partially benefit this year's corn crop; and by next year, its full effect will be available to help your fertilizer dollar go even further. If you aren't sure of the pH level of your corn ground, bring a representative sample of soil (one-pint size) to one of the Agway locations listed below. Your Agway man will be able to provide you with a quick analysis of the pH and recommend the amount of lime you'll need.

Then, talk to him about spreading a fertilizer extender-lime-on corn ground this spring.
