An invitation is extended to all farmers to attend an educational program on Manure Storage Systems and see various types of Manure Handling Equipment in action on Friday, March 19, 1976 at the John D. Cassel Farm, R2, Hummelstown, according to John P. Harris, county agent - agriculture.

Gerald Bodman, Penn State agricultural engineer, will present a program at 10:00 a.m. on various types of storage systems and economics of each storage system. His discussion will also include DER regulations and requirements.

Over the lunch hour, various agitator pumps will

begin agitation of the manure in the Cassel's earth bound storage unit. At 1:00 to 3:00 p.m., or later, manure will be pumped from the storage unit by different pumps and spread onto fields by various types of spreaders.

Types of equipment to be demonstrated will be a Liquefator, Vertical Pit Pump, Self Loading Spreader, Lagoon Pump, Spreader - Injection unit and a Vacuum Tank.

In addition to this, other equipment will be on display from 10:00 a.m. throughout the entire day for observation.
