## Lung screening planned

The March program of pulmonary function testing conducted by the Lancaster County Lung Association is announced by Miss Velma Hart, Executive Director. Tests will be conducted on Tuesday, March 23, 1976 at the Association office, 630 Janet Avenue. Hours will be from 4 to 8 p.m. and testing is done by appointment. Cost of the test is \$2.00. Call 397-5203 to make an appointment.

This screening measures lung capacity. It is useful in diagnosing symptoms of lung disease. Persons experiencing breathing difficulty or who are heavy smokers are advised to have the test. Tests are conducted by a respiratory therapist and the results interpreted by a pulmonary specialist.
