my life is an open book. I'm not pleased with the way portions of this meeting were

conducted. Especially some of the catty questions.

ROBERT WALKER
As Congressman Ed Eshleman's aide, I'd like to

continue the work we started and finished together. Some of the important issues we need to consider at this time are: 1. The inheritance tax. I

favor a \$200,000 exemption limit and that land be appraised on its agricultural value. That provision has to be in the legislation. 2. The farmer needs a free market economy. No government programs. A policy which says grow all you can and sell all you can. 3. Dairy imports should be set up so that foreign producers meet the same standards as those in this country.

Q1 — I grew up on a farm as a boy and worked on farms as a teenager.

Q2 — Nuclear energy cannot be abandoned, but we must also concentrate on other sources. Reactors should be built in wide open areas.

Q3 — I'd consult farmers and farm leaders.

Q4 — Absolutely ... no doubt about it, unions have an unfair advantage in election campaigns. That is something which has to be stopped.

Q5 — There is no area in government which cannot be

cut, and it's time we do so, especially welfare.

Q6 — The value of farmer cooperatives has been proven over and over again. But protection is needed to avoid monopolies.

Q7 — I'm not sure of exact figures. We've spent about \$3,000 so far. I'm not accepting donations in excess of \$100. The office should not be sold to the highest bidder.

Specific question: How have you differed with Eshleman's voting? I differed with him on the beef research question, beyond that we have no differences.

Concluding Remark: Please evaluate the records — mine and those of others.

I'm worried about debt on all levels. What are we going to do? The U.S. Labor Party proposes a debt moratorium and we must have it. I predict a financial collapse and chaos in the United States if the debt moratorium is not passed by March 31. In Europe the economies are already collapsing and there is mass turmoil right now. Those

countries are falling apart. In the United States we have inadequate transportation, poor health care, not enough food, and not enough insurance.

Q1 — (Answer irrelevant).

Q2 — Nuclear energy is insane, they shouldn't be anywhere and at best they are only a 200-year solution.

Q3 — I'd go to farmers, but the rest of the population has an equal voice in how food is produced. The Labor Party supports the NFO (National Farmers Organization).

Q4 — It's a question not of power, but of how to solve the political-economic mess.

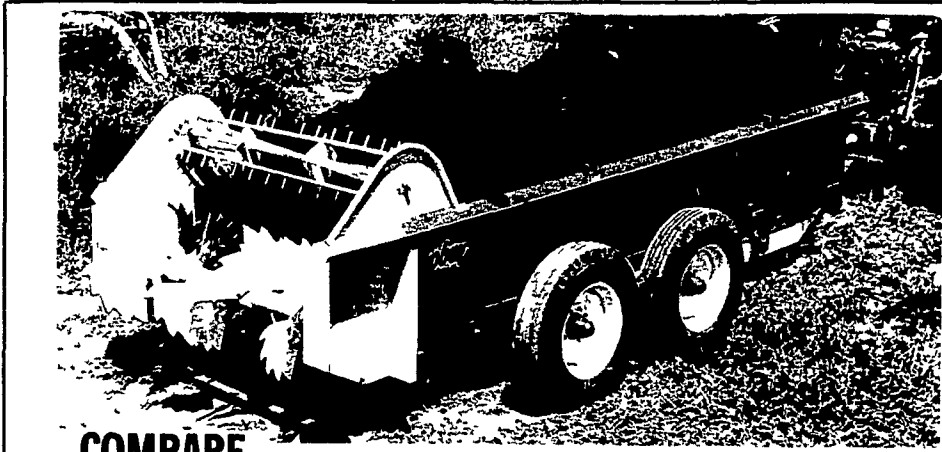
Q5 — Any cuts in government spending would mean death to our society.

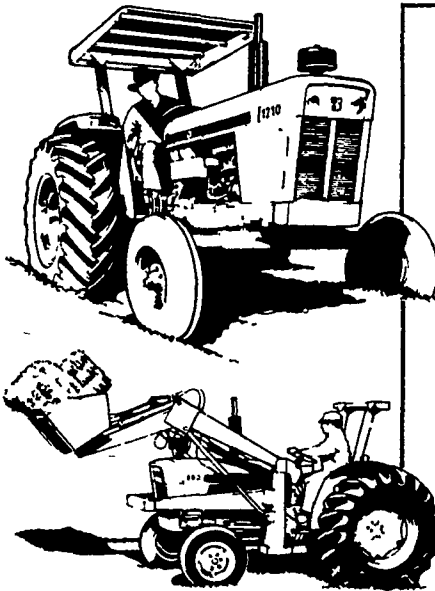
