After 10 to 15 years of accident and health records exemption from regulatory for employees, any paid requirements, farmers are coming under increased scrutiny, losing most of their Health Act specifications. previous exemptions as employers of labor, and literally being bombarded by a host of necessary adjustments in plant operations, bookkeeping and safety precautions. "There are certain things the law requires," she stated to the farm women. "It will be your job as partners in this business to help us disseminate formation."

instructions for all equipeven if he only pays him \$1 per year, comes under the OSHA regulations. Even members of a farmer's family, previously exempt from this law, who are paid for their labor, force the farmer employer to comply.
