## Krank sets example in campaign spending

candidate Donald F. Krank announced today that his expenditures thus far for the Republican Congressional race, prepaid through April 17, 1976, the reporting date, have been \$476.85. He further indicated that he has filed a campaign report although not required to do so by law since his expenditures have been under \$1,000. Krank further stated that projected expenditures for the remainder of the campaign would not exceed \$200.00 and that he expected his total campaign spending to be slightly less than \$700.00.

Krank once again called for restrictions on campaign spending in general. He

Republican Congressional indicated that "during the course of this campaign it has become evident that the spending inbalance creates merely an "identity" election. As he discussed in an interview with the Lancaster New Era, he feels that a spending limit whether the funds are provided by the person individually or through contributions of \$5,000 is certainly adequate for running a congressional campaign in a three county district.

> Krank went on to say that the bulk of his expenditures have been for advertising with the balance being primarily postage and printing.

### Walker speaks at coffee

L'ANCASTER - Robert S. "Bob" Walker, GOP candidate for Congress, said this week that performance rather than image should be the yardstick by which voters measure their next Congressman.

Speaking at a coffee in the home of Mr. and Mrs. Marvin Humphries, 1550 Country Club Drive, Lancaster, Walker said that "a known quanity is the best quarantee of legislative quality.

"Several of my opponents have emphasized integrity and honesty as a part of their image building campaigns, but my unblemished record of 10 years in the public eye speaks for itself.

"An opponent has called

for full financial disclosure by Federal officials, but I'm the only candidate who has put his personal finances on public record," Walker said. "Some of my opponents

have talked about their capacity for legislative leadership, but I have demonstrated my ability to provide that leadership.

"All of my opponents have spoken out against special interest, but I've done something about limiting special interest power by limiting campaign contributions to \$100.

"Actions still speak louder than words, and performance should be more important than public relations images," the candidate stated.

"When the people chose a Congressman, I'm confident that they will consider a man's record more important than campaign rhetoric," he concluded.


