Sinking Spring Farm, York R5, was the high herd with 61.7 pounds milk and 2.45 pounds B.F. on 69.5 Holsteins. Second high was Thomas Boyer, York, with 55.3 pounds milk and 2.19 pounds B.F. on 33 Holsteins. The high cow was Light, a six-year old registered Holstein owned by Sinking Spring Farm and producing 931 pounds of B.F. and 19,551 pounds milk at a 4.8 percent test. Second high was Sonia a five-year old registered Holstein owned by David Stewart, Delta producing 20,215 pounds of milk at 4.3 percent for 867 pounds of B.F.
