**Wildfire problem
increased during
early days in April**

HARRISBURG — Pennsylvania's wildfire problem increased considerably over the past week with an additional 415 fires reported throughout the Commonwealth, the Department of Environmental Resources announced this week.
Statistics provided by the Department's Division of Forest Fire Prevention now show a total of 1,020 wildfires since the beginning of 1976 compared to 482 for the same period of time in 1975.
Wildfires during the past week, from Monday through

Lancaster Farming, Saturday, April 24, 1976—95
Sunday night, involved 3,528 acres making a total of 6,691 acres swept by fire so far this year. Some 1,284 acres were burned over during the same period of time in 1975.
A breakdown of the number of fires reported over the weekend - from Good Friday to Easter Sunday, - was not available but the Division assumed that a large majority of the 415 fires reported occurred during those three days.
Earlier in the week, prior to the opening of the trout season on Saturday, the Division warned fishermen of the fire hazard and asked that they be extremely careful with fire. The fishermen cooperated and only one fire, caused by an angler, was reported.
