Southern Chess Pie 1 unbaked 9 inch pie shell ½ cup butter

1 cup sugar 1/4 cup flour

½ cup evaoprated milk 2 egg yolks

1 teaspoon vanilla 1/8 teaspoon salt

2 egg whites ¼ cup sugar 1/4 teaspoon salt

Cream butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Add flour, milk, egg yolks, vanilla and salt. Beat well. Pour into unbaked pie shell. Bake at 350 degrees for 45 minutes. Cool slightly. Beat egg whites until frothy. Add sugar and salt beating until stiff and glossy. Spread filling. meringue over Return to oven and bake 5-7 minutes.

German Smoked Pork Roast

4 pounds pork loin-center cut roast salt

pepper 1 jar horseradish glaze hickory chips cherry tomatoes endive

Rub fat side of roast with salt and pepper. Place roast on grill over medium coals with drip pan. As roast browns add soaked hickory chips to coals. Put lid of grill on and roast two hours or until meat is browned. Glaze with horseradish when browned and garnish with tomatoes and endive.

Zippy Deviled Eggs 8 hard cooked eggs 2 tablespoons mayonnaise 2-3 teaspoons lemon juice

teaspoon prepared mustard

teaspoon spicy sauce mixture ½ teaspoon salt

⅓ teaspoon pepper

Cut eggs lengthwise and remove yolk. Mash yolks with fork and combine with remaining ingredients Refill whites of eggs. Makes 16 egg halves.

**Barbequed Beef Strips** 2 pounds beef round steak cut ¾ inch thick

prepared mustard flour

4 cup cooking fat 1 clove garlıc, minced

½ cup finely chopped onion ½ cup diced green pepper ¼ cup finely cut celery leaves

1/4 cup parsley

1 can (8 oz.) tomato sauce 1 cup water

1/4 cup vinegar

2 tablespoons sugar ½ teaspoon salt

Cut steak into strips 11/2 inches wide and 3 inches long. Brush with mustard and lightly dip in flour. Brown in hot skillet with fat. Place in baking dish and add vegetables to frying pan. Saute vegetables adding tomato sauce, water, vinegar sugar and salt. Simmer 10 minutes and pour over meat. Bake in a slow oven 325 degrees for two


