### Pa. poultry going strong

HARRISBURG — Poultry production in Pennsylvania was on the increase for the week ending May 8, with 1,639,000 placements of broiler chicks, according to the Crop Reporting Service.

Placements were 21 percent above the corresponding week a year earlier and three percent above the previous week.

Average placements during the past ten weeks were 15 percent above a year earlier.

In the 21 key poultry producing states, placements were 67,967,000, one percent below the previous week, but 15 percent more than the same week a year earlier. Average placements during the past ten weeks were two percent above a year ago.
