

Regulatory committee to meet

WASHINGTON, D.C. - The U. S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Advisory Committee on Regulatory Programs will examine USDA programs that regulate how, where, and when farm products can be marketed at its first meeting June 8 and 9, 1976, here.

Secretary of Agriculture Earl L. Butz established the special advisory panel in March. "The Secretary

asked us to evaluate how well these programs contribute to the orderly marketing of U.S. farm products," says Donald E. Wilkinson, executive secretary of the committee and administrator of USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service (AMS). "We also plan to review the impact of the programs on farm income and consumer prices." The committee will meet twice a year for two years

The agenda for the committee's first meeting includes a summary and current analysis of USDA regulatory programs. The panel will define the areas it will evaluate and hear reports on studies conducted by USDA marketing and consumer program regulatory task forces. The meeting is open to the public. Committee Chairman Richard L. Feltner, USDA assistant secretary for

marketing and consumer services, may invite public participation as time permits. Written statements may be submitted to the committee either before or after the meeting.
