Broilers and Fryers - Market undertone firm and supplies adequate for an improved demand. Estimated slaughter by Virginia processors today 681,000 head of broilers and fryers and 54,000 head of rock cornish totaling 735,000. This compares with 595,000 head of broilers and fryers and 55,000 head of rock cornish last Wednesday.

Ready to cook movement including chilled and frozen products good with prices mostly 1 cent higher. Negotiated prices 2-3 lb. ice packed broilers and fryers for today's delivery trucklot sales of plant grade 43-44 cents.

Fowl - Offerings of both light and heavy type short for a moderate demand and too few sales to report.

Turkeys - Supplies short for plant requirements. Estimated slaughter by Virginia processors today 44,000.
