## Hog cholera quarantines lifted

Federal and state hog cholera quarantines were lifted on recently from Hillsborough county, N.H., ending all such quarantines in the country for the first time since March 2, the U. S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) announced.

Officials of USDA's Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) said hog cholera surveillance will continue in the former outbreak areas of New England and N.J. The last remaining quarantines in R.I., N.J., and Mass. were lifted in April and May.


A highly infectious viral disease of swine, hog cholera was diagnosed in late February and early March in N.J., R.I., and Mass. The disease was found April 28 in New Hampshire. Hog cholera cannot be contracted by other animals or humans.

## Wool pull scheduled

FLEMINGTON, N.J. - New Jersey wool producers will hold their annual wool pool on the weekend of June 25th, including that very afternoon and continuing through Sunday. The pool will close each day at 6 p.m. and open at 8 a.m. except for on the first day (Friday) when it opens at 1 p.m.

The pool is organized by the New Jersey Sheep and Cooperative Association and wool producers from the Garden State.




