 Four day receipts were 20,100 this week, 16,200 previous week and 17,400 a year ago. Marketings were rather liberal, but were well distributed over the trading period. The week in need of cattle for immediate requirements and were fairly aggressive for numbers. After the initial downturns, prices followed a stable pattern despite only limited support from the carcass trade.
