

91st National Holstein Convention slated for Phila.

PHILADELPHIA, Pa. - Host Day activities and delegates from all parts of the United States will be on hand when the 91st annual meeting of the Holstein-Friesian Association of America convenes in Philadelphia on June 30 and July 1. The Sheraton Hotel, 1715 John F. Kennedy Boulevard, Philadelphia, will serve as convention headquarters and site of the annual meeting. Host for the four-day convention is the Pennsylvania Holstein Association. William L. Gwynham, Shavertown, Pa., a former member of the HFAA Board of Directors, will serve as general chairman. The actual business meeting will be preceded by

Host Day activities and HFAA and HFS board meetings. Delegates will have before them two proposals to revise the Association Bylaws. A revision sponsored by the Board of Directors represents changes in procedure for election of delegates to the annual convention. The second revision involves a proposal to further liberalize the color marking provisions, under the sponsorship of a group of six members. Pennsylvania leads all states in the number of delegates based on active membership. Over 200 junior members of Holstein-Friesian Association will also participate in the convention.

The history of our country, dairy educational programs, and plenty of fun will highlight the junior's stay. Special ladies activities have been arranged which include a luncheon and historical entertainment. Convention activities will come to a close with the National Convention Sale on Friday morning, July 2. Approximately 70 head of the finest Registered Holsteins from across the nation have been specially selected for the sale managed by the Pennsylvania Holstein Association and R. Austin Backus, Inc., Mexico, N.Y. The sale will be held at the Guernsey Sales Pavilion east of Lancaster at the junction of Rt.'s 30 and 896.

Taking the top spots in the modified and super stock categories were:

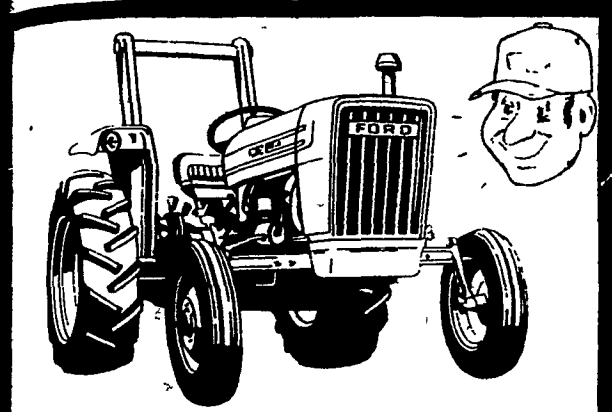
5200 lb. modified - Nathan Wolfe, Bedford R2, driving a F20 Farmall with a 413 Chrysler engine.
