USDA suspends grain inspection agency

WASHINGTON, D.C. -Grain inspection officials in the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) announced today that they have suspended designation of the Greater Baton Rouge' Port Commission as an official grain inspection agency. The suspension was made at the commission's request.

In announcing the action, a spokesman for USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service (AMS) said South Louisiana Grain Service, Inc., has been authorized to provide grain inspection services on an interim basis at facilities previously served by the port commision.

On Jan. 23, AMS grain inspection officials initiated proceedings to permanently revoke the official

HARRISBURG - Poultry production in Pennsylvania 21 key states were 12 percent continued above 1975 levels during the week ending June 12, 1976. According to the Pennsylvania Crop Reporting Service, placement of broiler chicks in the commonwealth were 1,637,000. This figure is 14 percent above the same week a year earlier, but eight percent below the previous week.

Average placements during the past ten weeks were 18 percent above a year ago.

In the 21 key poultry producing states, placements were 68,575,000, about the same as the previous week and 12 percent above the same period in 1975.
