## USDA suspends grain inspection agency

WASHINGTON, D.C. - Grain inspection officials in the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) announced today that they have suspended the designation of the Greater Baton Rouge Port Commission as an official grain inspection agency. The suspension was made at the commission's request.

In announcing the action, a spokesman for USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service (AMS) said South Louisiana Grain Service, Inc., has been authorized to provide grain inspection services on an interim basis at facilities previously served by the port commission.

On Jan. 23, AMS grain inspection officials initiated proceedings to permanently revoke the official

designation of the Greater Baton Rouge Port Commission as an official grain inspection agency. In a complaint filed that day, AMS charged the commission with failing to adequately supervise the

work of its licensed grain inspectors.

AMS officials said that the complaint and proceedings against the port commission are still pending, and the suspension does not affect the earlier action. The

temporary extension of South Louisiana Grain Services' designation for the last 90 days or until the commission is able to resume inspection activities or a replacement agency designated.

Under the U.S. Grain Standards Act, AMS is responsible for administering the national grain inspection system. AMS, however, has authority to provide original inspection of U.S. grain and is required to designate private firms and agencies as official grain inspection agencies in specific geographic areas.

## Poultry production up

HARRISBURG - Poultry production in Pennsylvania continued above 1975 levels during the week ending June 12, 1976. According to the Pennsylvania Crop Reporting Service, placement of broiler chicks in the commonwealth were 1,637,000. This figure is 14 percent above the same week a year earlier, but eight percent below the previous week.

Average placements during the past ten weeks were 18 percent above a year ago.

In the 21 key poultry producing states, placements were 68,575,000, about the same as the previous week and 12 percent above the same period in 1975.
