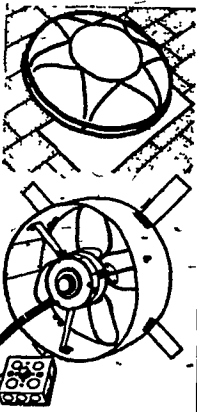

Receipts about 70 pct. slaughter steers: 25 pct. slaughter heifers and the balance mainly cows. Slaughter steers and heifers moved lower primarily due to a sharply lower dressed beef trade.
