Do you know the seven signs of an electrical crisis that may be brewing in your home? If fuses blow, lights dim when an appliance is used, or if a TV shrinks or jumps when an appliance is turned on you may have a crisis. To solve it, directions are given in a handy reference guide from Penn State on Electrical Tips for Everyone.

The course also details how to install your own light fixtures, outlets and switches and methods to use for testing fuses, circuits, cords and appliances.

Both outside and inside wiring are discussed in this 10-lesson course, with drawings and pictures used to illustrate the subject matter.

PEST CONTROL

If you have silverfish in your attic, ants on your kitchen counter, or fleas on your dog, a correspondence course from Penn State tells you how to get rid of these and other household pests.

Household insecticides are listed and safe ways to use them are given to rid a home of all invaders - springtails, roaches, termites, cereal pests, spiders and mice - and those occasional pests in between.

Lessons on insects present brief descriptions of the pest (s), the damage they do, and methods for their control. How to deal with spiders, rats, mice, bats and other

small anımals is also discussed.


