

Farmers briefed on

One thing about no till Hinton cautioned, you have to get rid of the insects. For that purpose latex was applied to the seeds (also effective against phreasant problems), and seven pounds of furadan per acre was applied at planting time. Hinton used 35 to 40 gallons of nitrogen (33 percent

Nitran) per acre (giving him about 140 units of N per acre) to which he added his herbicides one quart Paraquat two quarts Aatrex 41 (comparable to 2 1/2 pounds Atrazine), two pounds Princep, and one quart Toxaphene. A pint of Bavel was added for application to fields where there was alfalfa growing

A standard sprayer, Hinton pointed out, just won't handle the gallonage needed to do the job, so he purchased a John Blue sprayer which holds enough spray to treat about 10 acres. According to the Fleetwood farmer, the John Blue could stand some alterations for maximum performance on the kinds of hills he worked on the Kempton farm, but in his opinion, a standard no-till planter would not serve to handle the planting at all, and he rebuilt

it to accommodate the alopea before attempting planting.

The most serious problem Hinton encountered was the mice which took most of his first and some of his second plantings in some fields. He advised heavy disking ahead of time if you know the mice are there, but Dr. Bill McClellan, Penn State Extension agronomist who was on hand to answer the farmers' questions, had an alternate suggestion.

McClellan felt that the late application of the weed control materials may have

been against Hinton in handling the mice and advised applying the herbicides while the field is barren, which he feels will cause the mice to leave before the corn is planted.

McClellan applauded Hinton's initial step of testing and applying lime, pointing out that lime is "the first step in weed control. Although in McClellan's judgment, Hinton's weed control was quite acceptable, he expressed his preference for applying the herbicides before planting and then coming back later with Bavel to get any weeds that survived the main program when they have reached six to eight inches in height.

Trexler, who says he believes in no-till and in applying lots of nutrients to it, pointed out that although there is probably no class one or two soil on his property, "I think this corn is as good as you will find on any class one or two land. You can see the evidence of good management here," he added.

Following time for inspection of the corn crop which appeared uniform even on the furthest hills, the group met in another area of the Trexler farm for instruction on the use of Tordon 10K pellets now available for controlling multiflora rose.

McClellan advised the farmers present that Tordon 10K "is probably the hottest herbicide you have ever used" and cannot even be purchased without certification that the purchaser has been instructed in its use. The product is highly soluble and should not be used on slopes where it can wash into ponds, streams, or into areas where trees or plants grow. McClellan further cautioned that the material remains in the soil for about three years, adding that if cows are permitted to graze in a treated area, the animal and come out through the urine and the manure (but not the milk) which cannot then be used for fertilizer. He recommends staying at least 100 yards from water sources, shade trees, and desirable plant growth when applying the herbicide. McClellan further suggested that the practicality of using Tordon 10K would most likely depend on the severity of the problem with multiflora rose as it is only available in 55 pound cans, and a little bit goes a long way.

A demonstration of the efficiency of the Tordon 10K pellets was given at the Mark Balthaser farm in the Bernville area on August 9, where it had been applied 10 days prior to that meeting. According to County Agent Haldeman, during that period some of the multiflora rose bushes had been completely killed and others were turning yellow. The Berks County Agricultural Stabilization Conservation Service, the agent said, expects to have cost sharing available for use of Tordon 10K in 1977, and information on obtaining certification for its use may be obtained by calling the Extension Service office in Leesport.
