Soybean pusher seen

LEXINGTON, Ill. An experimental foliar fertilizer that promises to push U.S. soybean yields beyond current levels as early as next year was unveiled last month by Allied Chemical Corporation, as the company launched a massive field test program in 15 top soybean producing states.

Allied's Don Johnson, manager of Agronomic Services, said the new product, known as Follan, will be a significant breakthrough in soybean production if current commercial-scale testing demonstrates yield increases consistent with prior research. He spoke at Myers, Inc., a local fertilizer dealer, where the first tank car of the foliar material was unloaded and applied on nearby fields.

Favorable test results this year would mean that Follan will be commercially available for 1977. "Our research with similar experimental compounds indicates that yield increases in excess of 20 percent from a single foliar treatment may be possible with Follan," Johnson stated. "Tests also show that the compound could increase soybean oil content by approximately 13 percent, an important economic bonus."
