Peel and slice potatoes, onions, and carrots very thin. In a buttered casserole, place a layer of potatoes, a layer of onions, a layer of raw ground beef, and a layer of carrots. Over this, pour some tomato soup. (To get the mixture, combine one can of tomato soup with $\frac{1}{4}$ cup water.) Then, repeat the procedure until the casserole is full. Pour remaining soup mixture over the casserole and bake at 350F

COLLEGE PARK, Md. -August has been proclaimed as voter registration month by Governor Marvin Mandel on behalf of an ambitious "Get Maryland United" campaign being conducted by 4-H members throughout the Old Line State.

Voter registration is -the second major Bicentennial Year project resulting from the Maryland 4-H Continental Congress, which met one weekend last November at the State House in Annapolis.




