

Angus heifer show held

PEORIA, Ill. - For catmen attending the National Junior Angus Heifer Show in Peoria, Ill., it will long be remembered as one of the outstanding junior Angus activities in recent years. Throughout the two-day event which also hosted

the National Junior Angus Showmanship Contest, a total of 271 exhibitors paraded 394 head of some of the countries top heifers representing 22 states and Canada. Co-hosting the event at the Exposition Gardens, Peoria, was the American and Illinois Angus Associations.

In the classes judged by Bill Rishel, North Platte, Neb., grand champion honors went to a February yearling shown by young Murray Cornin III, Ada, Okla. The heifer, Emulous Lady 77, was selected yearling champion of the show before winning the final slap of approval for grand champion overall by Judge Rishel on the final day of competition.

Prior to attending the regional program, the participants competed in the county dress revue program on July 21, at the E. Brandywine Fire Hall in Guthriesville.

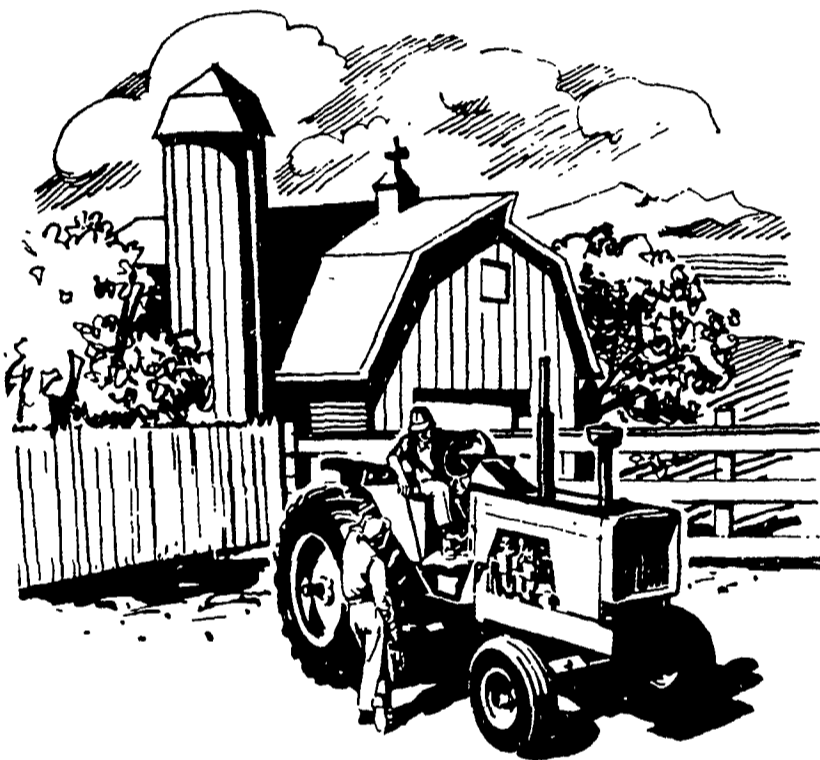
