
Angus heifer show held


Chester Co. sewer attends states

In the senior division of the style show, 48 girls over 14 Bucks, Berks, Delaware, Lehigh, Northampton and


state contest held at the H Club in Cochranville at- Montgomery counties modeled garments they made during the past year.
