Compared with the previous week's close, closing prices on slaughter steers 50 to 55 higher, instances 1.00 higher. Heifers firm to 50 higher. Cows 1.50-2.00 lower and bulls 2.00-3.00 lower.  
Four Day Receipts 15,000 compared 13,800 previous week and 14,600 a year ago.  
A weak undertone prevailed in the fed cattle trade the forepart of week, but prices advanced sharply at midweek in reflection of an upward surge on carcass beef. Late demand was generally good by all buying interests with most in need of cattle for immediate requirements.

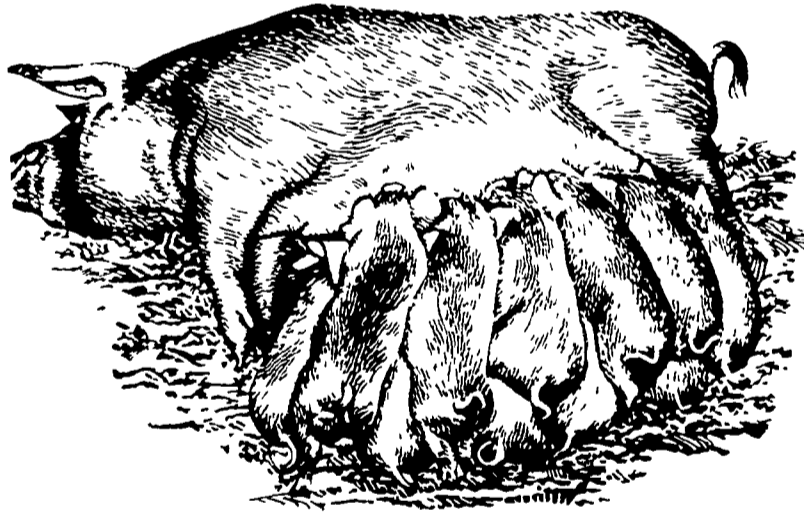
