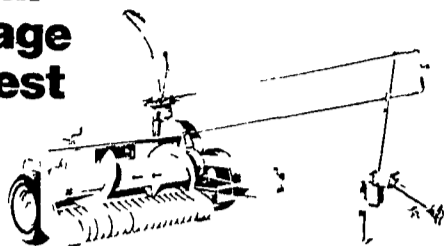

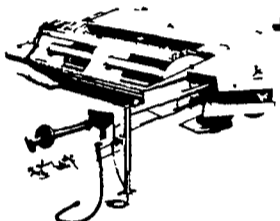

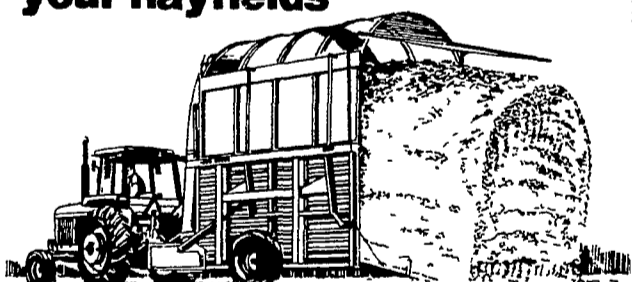

Three agents highly honored

UNIVERSITY PARK - Three Pennsylvania county Extension agents are among 110 agents in the United States who received Distinguished Service Awards on August 19 at the annual meeting of the National Association of County Agricultural Agents in Richmond, Va.

Those honored were Garner P. Mitchell, Potter County; John L. Rosenberger, Juniata County; and Herbert C. Terndrup, Cambria County.

According to John H. Holbert, Bedford County Extension Director and state awards committee chairman, the three men are being cited "for outstanding educational contributions to Pennsylvania's agriculture."

The awards program will highlight the annual meeting where about 2,500 county agents will convene August 16-19 to review their

responsibilities as educators.

Mitchell, a member of The Pennsylvania State University's Cooperative Extension Service staff for 22 years, is being honored for his educational work in the areas of farm management, dairy, youth, and community

planning. A native of Susquehanna County, Mitchell received a bachelor of science degree from Penn State.

Rosenberger, a native of Montgomery County, also has been a member of the Extension staff since 1954. He is receiving his awards on the basis of his youth, livestock, and weed control programs. He earned a bachelor of science degree from Penn State and master

of science degree from West Virginia University.

Terndrup, a native of Bucks County, was appointed to the Extension staff in 1951. He earned his bachelor and master of science degrees from Penn State. He was cited for his educational farm management, agronomy, and livestock programs.

The three county Extension agents will receive plaques at a special recognition program on August 19.

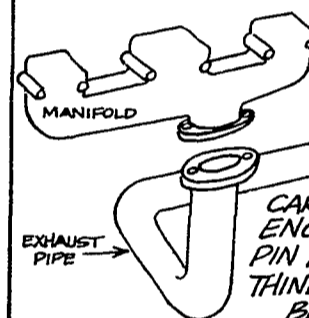
