FFA hold summer tour

MANHEIM - On Tuesday, August 17, the Manheim FFA held their annual summer tour and picnic. All members were invited. At nine o'clock, approximately 35 members and two agriculture teachers arrived at the school. From here, the tour of five farms began. The farms visited were those of Ronald Kreider, Tim Good, David Keller, Dennis Kulp, and Steve and Larry Hershey.

A new dairy operation to take care of 500 cows was the drawing card of the Ronald Kreider farm. At the operation partly belonging to Tim Good, the FFA treasurer, Good's

steers which are to be shown at the Farm Show were the main attraction. Good also showed his pigs which he owns in partnership with his father.

At the Keller farm, the hog farrowing set-up and new cage chicken house were the main attractions. Dave Keller is the Manheim FFA president.

Former member Dale Nolt showed his elaborate farrow-to-finish set-up to the tour members. He has a farrowing house in which he grows his pigs to between 40 and 100 pounds. Then, in his new finishing house he develops the hogs to approximately 220 pounds.

The farm of Dennis Kulp was the next stop. Here, Kulp showed his two Kutztown Fair dairy prospects. The final stop was the farm of Larry Hershey and Steve Hershey. Two aspects viewed were the steers which they plan to exhibit at the Manheim Farm Show and their cage chicken house.
