Four day receipts 16,600 as compared 14,800 previous week and 15,000 a year ago. Fed cattle prices edged slightly upward the fore part of week, but the mild upturn on steers was offset in later trading.

Moderately active, feeder cattle and calves weak to 50 cents lower, some sales 1.00 lower on Good offerings; majority receipts Mixed Good and Choice and Choice 500-850 lb. steers and 400-700 lb. heifers; continued dry conditions over a large portion of the marketing area, the main factor contributing to the liberal supplies; large attendance.

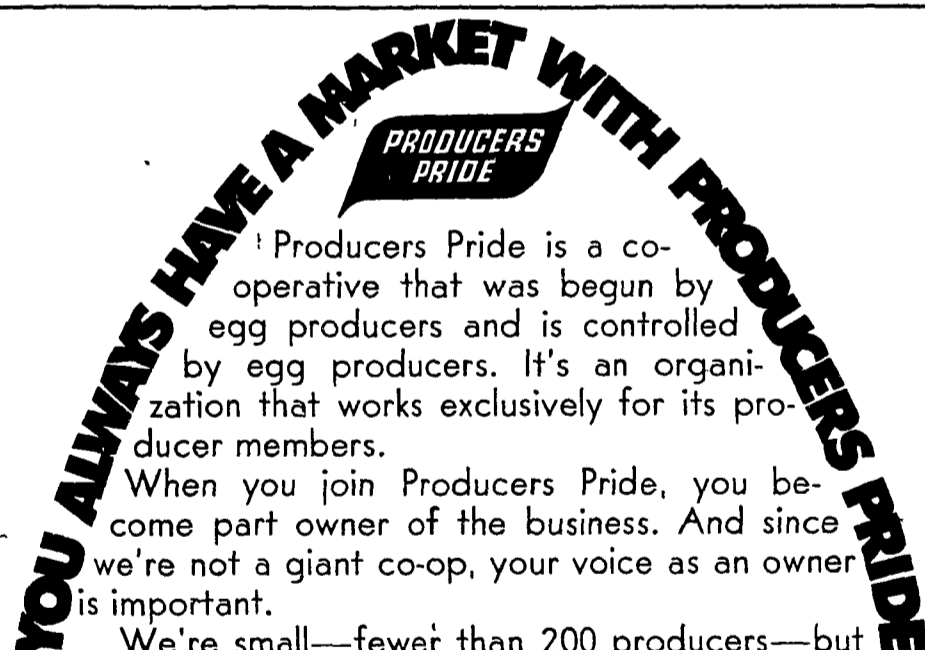
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
