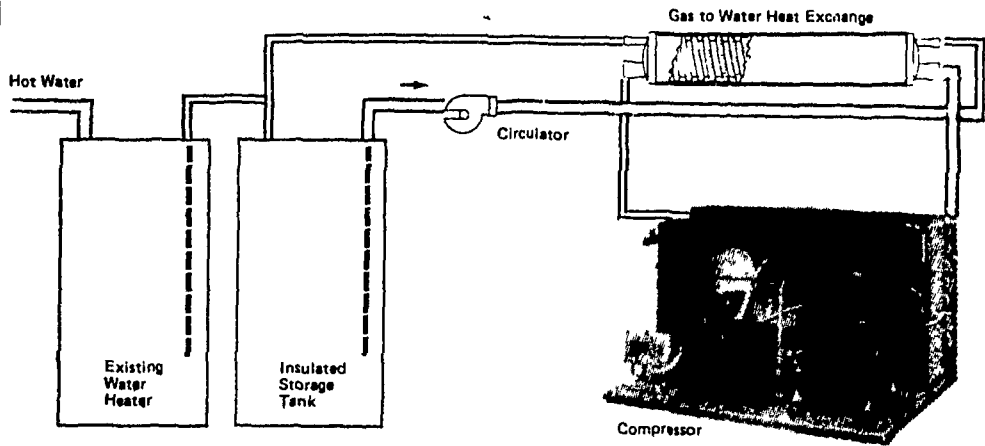

More wheat goes to Russia

WASHINGTON, D.C. - The U.S. Department of Agriculture last week announced a sale of 275,000 metric tons (10 million bushels) of U.S. Hard Red Winter wheat to the Soviet Union for shipment during the 1976-77 wheat marketing year (June-May). Shipment will be after Oct. 1, and the sale will count against the U.S.-U.S.S.R. Long-Term Grain Supply Agreement.

The sale was reported to the department under its

export sales reporting program which requires sales of 100,000 tons or more to a single destination to be reported to the department within 24 hours.

The sale announced last week brings total sales of U.S. wheat to the Soviet Union for shipment in the 1976-77 wheat marketing year to 2,054,000 metric tons (76 million bushels), and total sales of grain and soybeans to the Soviet Union out of the 1976 U.S. crops to 6.2 million metric tons.

Last week's sale brings total sales under the U.S.-U.S.S.R. Long-Term Grain Supply Agreement to 4,624,000 metric tons including 2,653,000 tons (104 million bushels) of corn and 1,971,000 tons of wheat (72 million bushels).

The agreement calls for the Soviet Union to purchase no less than 6 million metric tons of U.S. corn and wheat in approximate equal quantities for shipment each year (Oct.-Sept.) for a 5-year period beginning Oct. 1.

Tests are interpreted by a pulmonary specialist and reports are sent to the family physician.

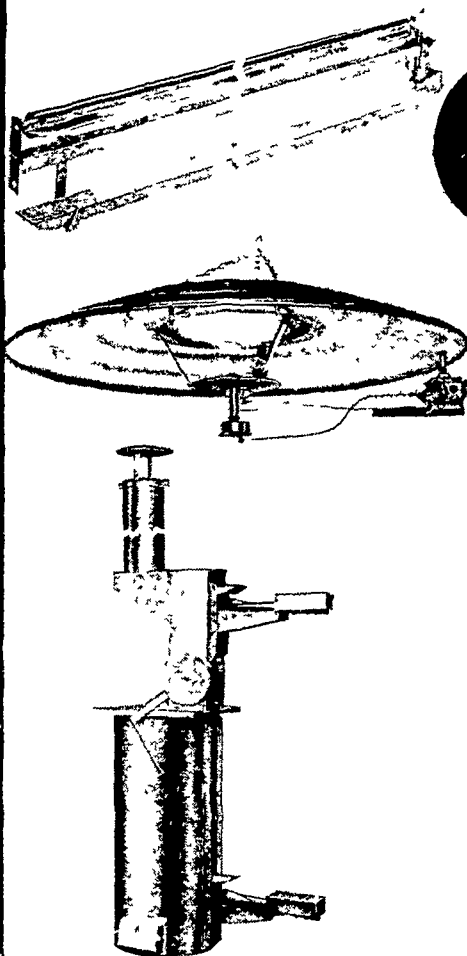
