


mushrooms

HARRISBURG - Pennsylvania led all states in the production of mushrooms with a record total nearly 180 million pounds. The value of sales for the fresh market mushrooms for the 1975-1976 season was \$45 million compared to \$33 million for the 1974-1975 season. The value of sales for the processed mushrooms for the 1975-1976 season was \$60.3 million compared to \$45.9 million for the 1974-1975 season.

Production of mushrooms in the United States reached a record high 309.8 million pounds for the year ending June 30, 1976. This topped last year's output of 299.1 million pounds by four per cent, and continued the trend of constant production increases since the survey began in 1966. A total of 25 states are included compared with 28 states the previous crop year. Pennsylvania continues to dominate production with 58 per cent of the Nation's total. During the 1974-1975 crop year Pennsylvania produced 60 per cent of the U.S. mushroom production.

Growers received \$191 million for the 1975-1976 crop, up 30 per cent from the 1974-1975 value.
