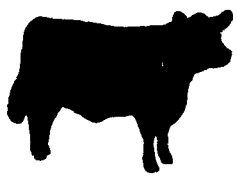

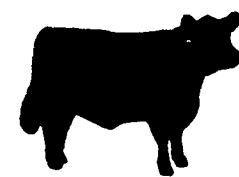
Wednesday, Sept. 15

 Herd dispersal out of Chester County Fresh cows and springers 600 to 895, other cows in mid lactation 450-600;  
 Herd dispersal out of Chester County fresh and close springers 300 to 420, cows in all stages of production 200 to 300, bred heifers 250 to 300.  
 A few of the better local fresh cows 650 to 970, mostly 400 to 600.  
 Bred cows 350 to 500, few springers 550 to 700.  
 Open Heifers 125 to 400.  
 Stock bulls 200 to 300, 1 Registered Bull 400.

## Omaha Cattle

Omaha September 16, 1976  
 Weekly 51 - Cattle - compared with the previous weeks close.  
 Closing prices on Slaughter Steers and Heifers were mostly weak to 25 cents lower, instances 50 off, some 3-5 1250-1450 lb. Steers 50-1.00 lower. Cows were 50-1.00 higher and Bulls firm to 1.00 higher.  
 Four day receipts 17,600 as compared 13,800 previous week and 18,200 a year ago. Fed Cattle prices ruled steady on a Monday outlay of 7,200 head, but prices weakened later under the pressure arising from liberal Slaughter and lowered carcass quotations. However, demand was generally good except for the several loads 3-5 1300-1450 lb. Steers which met narrow inquiry. The 26th annual T-Bone Special from the Audubon, Iowa area consigned more than 30 loads predominantly Choice Steers and Heifers for sale on Thursday. The overall finish of the Steer and Heifer supply was attractive with a liberal percentage Choice, and there was some increase in the number of new crop Steers and Heifers.
