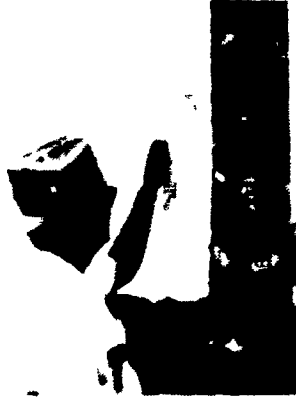
George Knight, Airville with 211 points. The Solanco FFA team was first in the event followed by Oxford, Kennard Dale, and Red Lion.

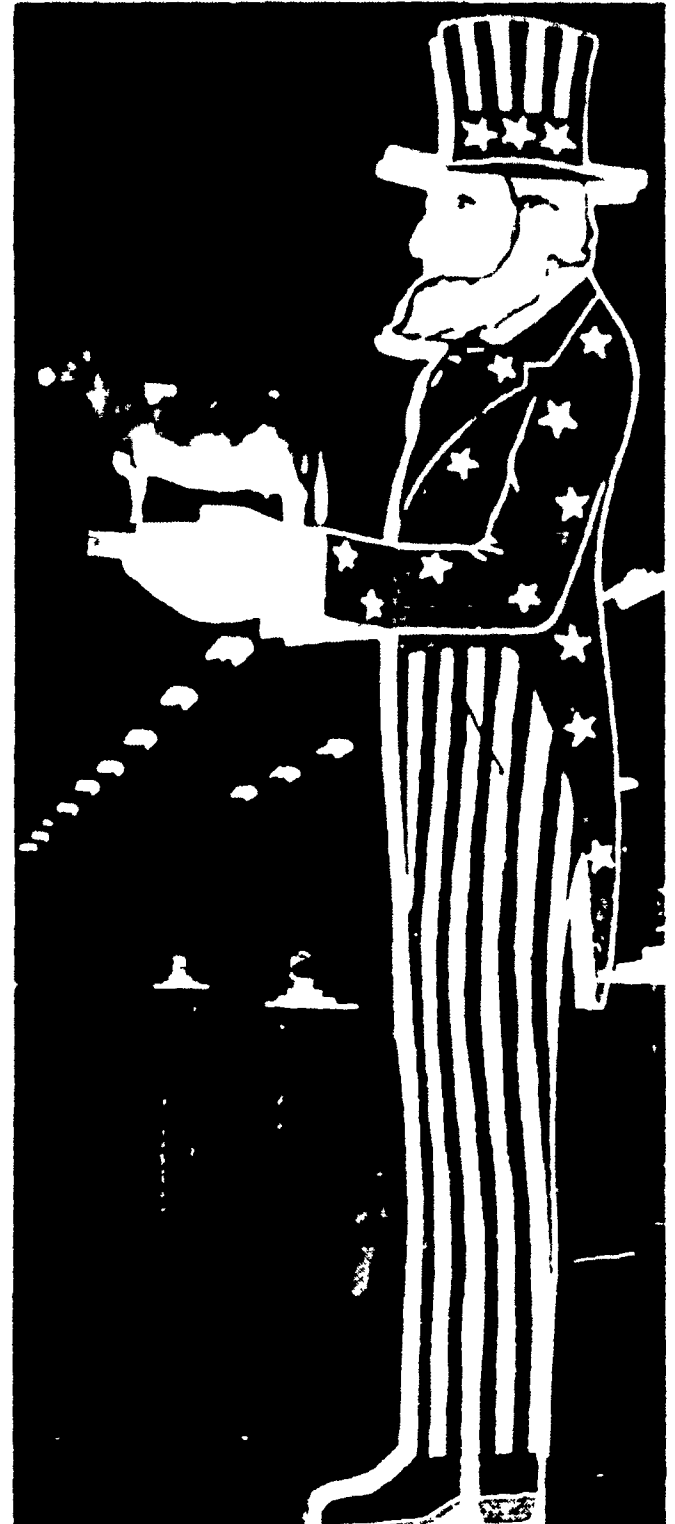

Posting one or more sides of trees, utility poles, fence posts or gates will get maximum attention from potential trespassers.

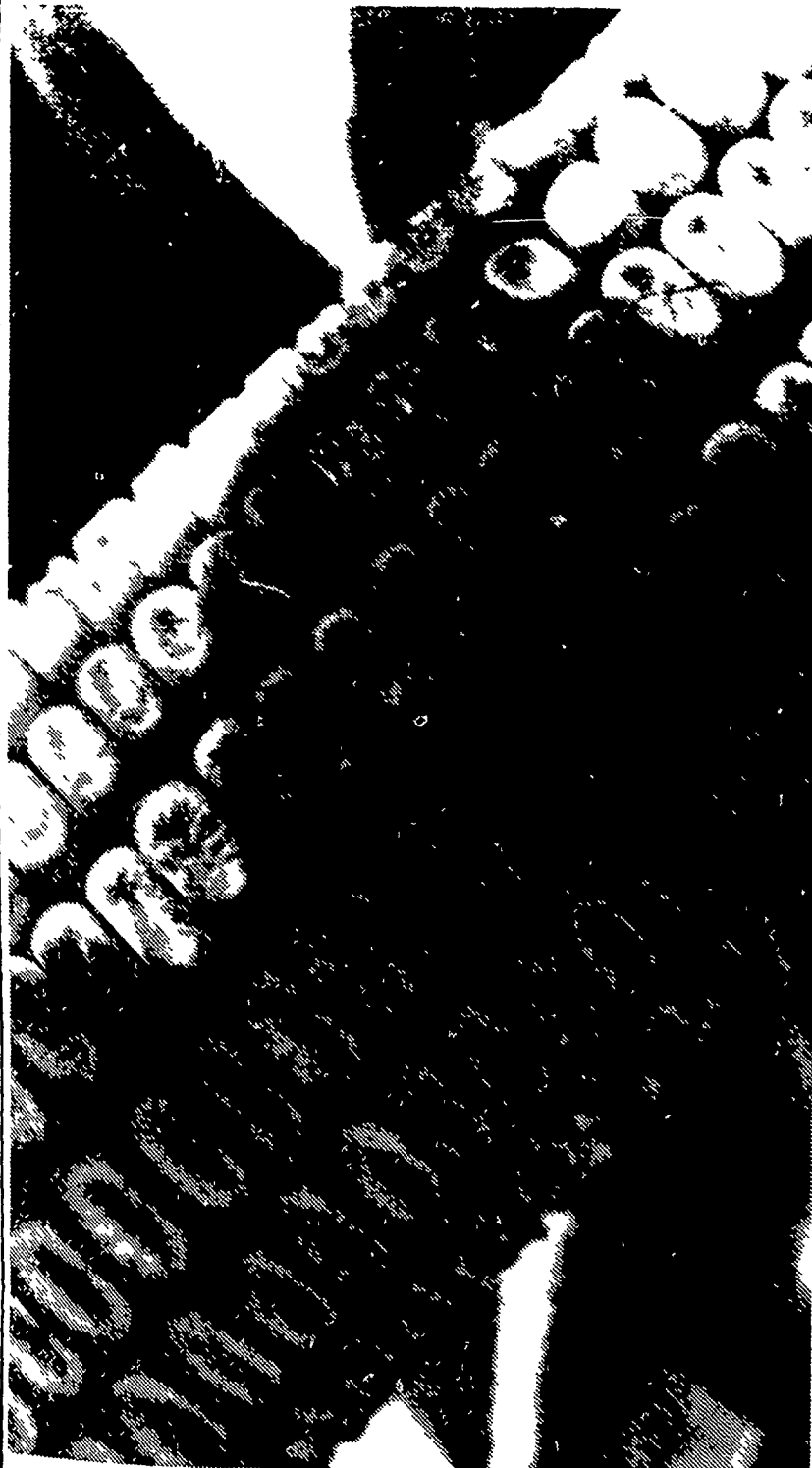
Instructions and tension bands with clips for quick easy stencil attachment and removal are included with stencil.
