## Girls show Jersey champions

HARRISBURG - Girls shut out the boys when it came to winning the champion

banners in the Jersey ring at the Pennsylvania Junior Dairy Show. Competing against the best in the state, the whole affair drew more than 600 entries, out of which

574 actually entered the arena.

Elizabeth Eick, 16, of Columbia Cross Roads, captured the grand and senior championships. Her 4-year-old cow, "Rolling Acres MH Two Penny," is sired by "Mariu Heritage." A 4-H

member for seven years, Elizabeth is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Eick. She also won a master fitter and showman award. "Damview L.H.R. Miss Lucky," a 4-year-old Jersey shown by Denise Adrien, 16, of 1562 Shadyside Road, West Chester, won reserve grand and reserve senior championship honors. The cow is sired by "Lavenders Highfield Ross." Denise, a 4-H member the past six years, is the daughter of Bruce Andrien. She also won a master fitter and showman award, and is the subject of a special feature elsewhere in this issue.

Darlene McConaughy, 13, Smicksburg R1, won the junior championship with "Huntsdale Nancy's Irene," a senior yearling. The heifer's sire is "Nancy's Sleeping Advancer." A 4-H member the past four years, Darlene is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Clyde McConaughy, Jr. She was the master fitter and showman champion for the breed.

Cynthia Waltemyer, 15, Collegeville R2, showed the reserve junior champion, "Walebe Quicksilver Laurel," a senior yearling. The sire is "S.S. Quicksilver of Fallneva." Cynthia, a 4-H member for seven years, is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Earl Waltemyer.

In the Brown Swiss show it was Judith Irons who had the grand champion, while Dean Daubert captured reserve as well as junior champion honors.

Dale Maulfair, Jonestown, managed to get by some stiff competition - much of which came from girls. Dale won the grand champion banner, but from there on down it was the girls who had the champions.

Denise Andrien, who had the reserve grand champion in the Jersey show, began her 4-H project in the usual way - by joining the local club and getting to work. But for her, it meant renovating a doll house into a calf pen. From that humble beginning six years ago came a "career" which now involves 35 head of dairy cattle. She and her younger brother, Bruce, are featured in a separate story elsewhere in this issue.

The other three girls to make it to the top in the Jersey ring were: Elizabeth Eick, grand champion; Darlene McConaughy, junior champion; and Cynthia Waltemyer, reserve junior champion. Miss Eick, 16, is from Columbia Cross Roads and has

been a 4-H'er for seven years. This year was the first time she had a grand champion at this show, although she's won a number of ribbons at county and district events. The daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Eick, she owns six Jerseys within her father's herd of 40.

This, the 21st annual Pennsylvania Junior Dairy Show, was directed by W. Paul Anderson, Penn State, with the help of executive committee members - T.W. Crittenden, Wellsboro; Duane Duncan, Carlisle; Frank Bortz, Penn State; J.C. Fink, Harrisburg; Charles Itle, Harrisburg; Merle Miller, Carlisle; Robert Kauffman, Elizabethtown; and William Guyer, Albion.

Exhibitors were presented with appropriate ribbons and banners, along with prize money (up to \$15 for first place) and a plaque for breed champions given by respective breed associations. Special awards were furnished by Hershey Foods Corporation and Harvey Stineman of the Stineman Ribbon and Trophy Mfg. Co.

Judges for the big event included John McKittrick, Columbus, Ohio; Merton Sowerby, Princeton, N.J.; Bonnie Miller, Towanda; Brian Harris, Miland; Galen Smith, Shippensburg; and Ginger Secrist, Fayetteville.
