

# Girls take top swine honors at New Holland

NEW HOLLAND, Pa. — Esta Lapp, Kinzers R 1, showed the championship market weight pig at the New Holland Community Fair, Thursday.

Reserve champion went to James Martin, New Holland R2, who also showed a cross.

Esta said she has been a member of the New Holland Community 4-H Club for five years and has always shown pigs. She said, "I like to show. I was surprised to have grand champion."

When asked if she was sad about selling her pig, she said, "Now that I won it does." She said it is not difficult to get a pig ready to show "as long as they are tame." She said the pig she showed this year was so

tame she could "scratch it under the ear and on the belly. The pig really liked it."

She isn't sure how she'll spend the money she gets when she sells her pig, but said, "I'll probably use it for Christmas."

Champion showman was William Hughes, East Earl R1, and champion fitter was Saralee (Sally) Martin, New Holland R 2.

Sally is in her seventh year of 4-H, having had pig projects since she became enrolled. She said she likes the pig project "because it brings in money to help later." She said she didn't do too much to prepare for fitting, but washed her pig good with soap and water. It

is customary to shave a pig's ears and tails for fitting, but Sally said she tried a hair removal cream this year and it worked really well.

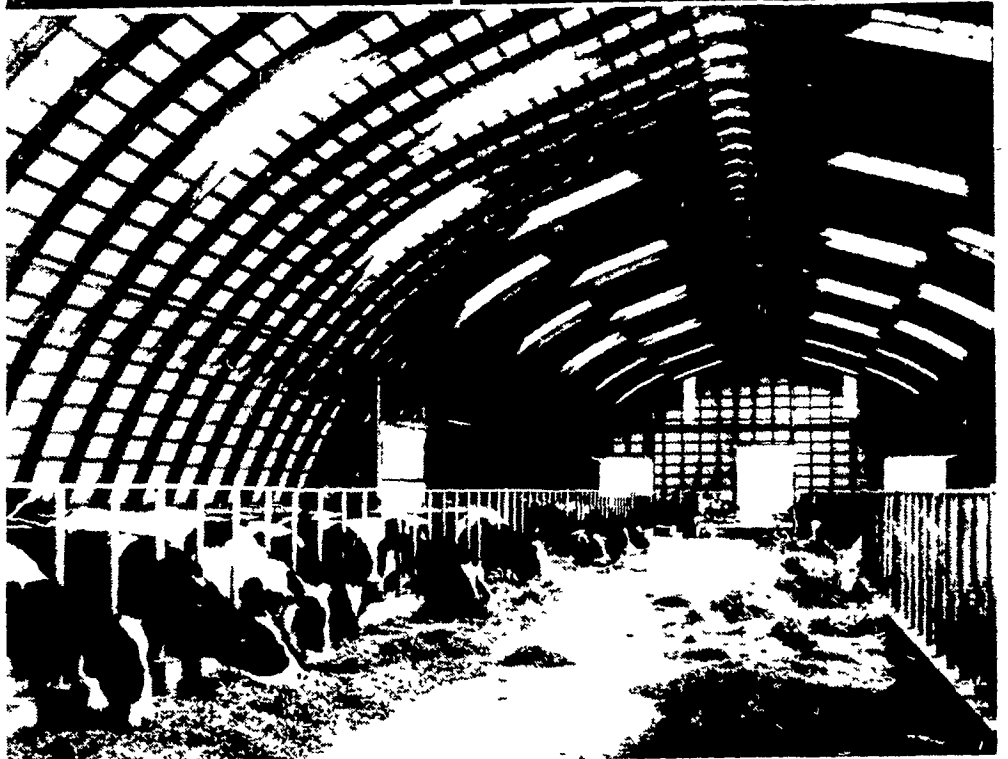
